GASLAMP BREAKFAST
COMPANY debuted on Sixth
and J, with a menu similar to what's
being served at its popular sister
restaurant, North Park Breakfast
Company: beet lattes, mashed potato
waffles with cheese sauce, churro
French toast, and coffee in oversize
mugs. It's the 16th restaurant for
Johan Engman, who owns the
Breakfast Republic chain and El
Jardín Cantina in Liberty Station.
Engman is also converting the
Hillcrest location of Fig Tree Cafe
into a Breakfast Republic.

Big news for South Bay: Craft brewer NOVO BRAZIL expanded from Eastlake and opened its second location in Otay Ranch. The space is huge—12,000 square feet—and it's packed with artwork, games, TVs, and a restaurant serving Brazilian fare like feijoada (bean and pork stew).

Davin Waite of Wrench & Rodent Seabasstropub fame opened **THE PLOT**, a plant-based restaurant that has vegan sushi options on the menu, in South Oceanside.

After a delay, **LUMI BY AKIRA BACK** is set for a February opening on the corner of Fifth and J in the Grand Pacific Hotel building in the Gaslamp. It's a modern Japanese concept from Back, who has two Michelin stars and successful restaurants in Las Vegas (Kumi in Mandalay Bay and Yellowtail

in the Bellagio).

The new year also started off with a few restaurant closures: Chef DJ Tangalin closed GAYA GAYA, his modern Filipino restaurant in Miramar; the La Jolla location of DONOVAN'S STEAK & CHOP HOUSE closed at the end of 2019; and MCCORMICK & SCHMICK'S, a steak and seafood restaurant inside the Omni Hotel, closed without warning on New Year's Day.
